The 4th of January marks World Braille Day, which is a day to help raise awareness of the importance of braille as a way of communicating for people with a visual impairment.



If you are not visually impaired, you use your eyes to read. But this is difficult, or not possible, for anyone who has a visual impairment. Braille is not a language, but is a system of raised dots that can be read using finger tips. This “code” can be written and read in dozens of languages, such as English, Spanish, Arabic and Chinese. Braille is used by thousands of people all over the world in their native languages, and provides a way of communicating for everyone!
