Quick Fact Number 1 - Did you know?

Essex has one of the longest coastlines of any county in England measuring 350 miles long. One of the most diverse, a place of surprising wild beauty, and rich in wildlife, the Essex coast is also one of the most vulnerable to flooding.

Quick Fact Number 2 - Did you know?

Trees play a vital role in combating Climate Change by removing dangerous carbon emissions from the atmosphere. Around 375,000 trees will be planted in Essex over the next five years to help tackle climate change. This is the equivalent to the size of 210 football pitches.
